- The written examination will be of one shift, in which the total number of questions will be 100 and the time duration will be two hours. The questions of the examination will be objective and multiple choice type. Each question will be of one mark. Negative marking will be given for the written examination, which will be $\frac{1}{4}$ of the full marks of that question i.e. 25 percent marks for each wrong answer.

[Exam Syllabus]

Part-1 Hindi Knowledge and Writing Ability

- Candidates will be asked questions to test their knowledge of Hindi language and their understanding and writing ability. (This question paper will be of the level of Intermediate Examination of the Board of Secondary Education, Uttar Pradesh)

Part-2 General Intelligence Test

- The purpose of this test is to measure the ability to understand and reason about a new situation, analyze and identify its various elements. This test will have questions based on understanding instructions, finding relationships, similarities and consistencies, drawing conclusions and similar intellectual activities.

Part-3 General Information

- This part of the question paper is to assess the candidate's general knowledge about the surrounding environment and his ability to use it in the society. In this test, such questions will also be asked which will assess the knowledge of such contemporary events and facts that are visible and experienced every day, which may also include historical and geographical facts (especially related to India) and their scientific aspects, which will This can be expected from any educated person.

Part-4 Knowledge of concepts of computer and information technology and contemporary technological development and innovation in this field.

- In this part of the question paper, candidates will be required to know about computer and information technology, hardware, software, operating system, spreadsheet, e-mail, social networking, e-governance, digital financial tools and applications, Internet and World Wide Web (WWW).), an overview of future skills and cyber security, elements of word processing and technological developments and innovations in the field of computer and information technology (Artificial Intelligence, Big Data Processing, Deep Learning, Machine Learning, Internet of Things). Questions will be asked based on India's achievements in this field.

Part-5 General information related to the state of Uttar Pradesh

- In this part of the question paper, candidates will be asked to have specific knowledge of Uttar Pradesh – history, culture, art, architecture, festivals, folk dance, literature, regional languages, heritage, social customs and tourism, geographical landscape and environment, natural resources, climate. Questions will be asked based on soil, forest, wildlife, mines and minerals, economy of Uttar Pradesh, agriculture, industry, business and employment, polity and administration and current events and achievements of the state of Uttar Pradesh in various fields.

Special note regarding written examination

- Junior Assistant, Junior Clerk and Assistant Level – III. 15 times the number of category wise candidates against the advertised posts for the written examination, including all the candidates securing the final cutoff marks/percentile score (up to 02 places of decimal), will be shortlisted for the main examination.

If the examination is conducted in more than one shift/day then the process of normalization of scores will be applicable for comparative evaluation of the candidates.
